Dr. Neil T. Anderson Joins Williamson College's Faculty

FRANKLIN, Tenn. (Feb. 27, 2012) – Dr. Neil T. Anderson, an internationally known minister, speaker and author, has joined the faculty of Williamson College. Beginning in the fall term, he will serve as adjunct professor of discipleship counseling.

Anderson is founder of Freedom in Christ Ministries, which has several offices around the world and representatives in 30 countries. For the past 25 years, he has ministered all over the world to a variety of church denominations. Last year alone he traveled to Germany, Switzerland, Italy, Liberia, South Africa, Columbia, Brazil, Argentina and Canada.

Prior to his international ministry, he was chairman of the practical theology department at Talbot School of Theology for 10 years. He has five earned degrees, including two doctorates, and has authored or co-authored 60 books.

Anderson is uniquely qualified to discuss and answer questions about discipleship, counseling, inner healing and deliverance. He has written books about depression, anxiety disorders, anger, chemical addiction, reconciliation, sexual addiction, marriage and church conflict resolution.

“My focus is to bring Jesus Christ back into our lives, marriages and ministries through genuine repentance and faith in God,” he said.

“I’m confident that Dr. Anderson will make significant contributions as Williamson College prepares students to be on mission for Christ in the 21st century,” said President Ed Smith, adding that he considers Anderson one of the most effective voices in teaching and leading the church over the last 30 years.

Founded in 1998, Williamson College is a non-profit organization that serves students of all ages, including non-traditional ones who typically are older students already in the workforce. Classes are usually held one evening a week and one class at a time. Williamson College is not related to a denomination and is guided by a ten-member board of trustees.
