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Williamson College Launches Online Program to Provide General Education College Credit for Dual High School or Home School Enrollment

FRANKLIN, Tenn. (Feb. 22, 2013) –[Williamson College](http://www.williamsoncollege.edu) today announced a program to provide cost-effective, biblical worldview perspective general education courses for dual credit to high school and homeschool students.

“This is an opportunity for homeschool and traditional high school students to get an early start on college while also saving significant tuition dollars,” said Ed Smith, president of Williamson College.

The college provides three options ranging from a 30-credit block for \$5,550 to a 37-credit block for \$6,845. Student course materials, which average \$45 per student, are additional. Students may enroll on the fifteenth day of each month.

Through this program, students can enroll in degree programs with as many as 61 credits, reducing their time and cost to earn a college degree. Williamson College also has a monthly tuition payment plan available for students. The following are the courses offered through this program:

- English Composition/History II (6 credits)
- Communication/English Literature (6 credits)
- English Literature/Math (6 credits)
- Humanities/Social Science (6 credits)
- Science/Social Science (7 credits)
